Ordinance No 93
An Ordinance to amend Sections one and two of Ordinance No Eleven, entitled an Ordinance relating to the protection of buildings against fire" etc

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany

That Sections one and two of Ordinance eleven entitled an Ordinance relating to the protection of buildings against fire," do be and the same are hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec 1 All owners or occupants of buildings or parts of buildings covered with wooden roofs in this City, using stoves or furnaces thereon shall be and be held to be required to erect good and substantial brick flues through such wooden roof and ceiling overhead and to connect the stove or furnace pipe with such brick flue horizontally at least eighteen inches below the wood of which such roof or ceiling is composed; and all such brick flues shall be of sufficient height above such roof to effectually prevent the same from communicating fire. In all cases where stoves or furnace pipes are required to pass through wooden partitions or ceiling the same shall be securely enclosed in a good and sufficient fireproof stove pipe safe. That Section two of said Ordinance be amended so as to read as follows

Sec 2 Any person using a stove within the City shall within eighteen inches of a wooden wall or brick, surround in place and keep some non-combustible material the full length and breadth of such stove between the same and the wooden wall; and all stoves in use in the City standing on a wooden floor less than eighteen inches from the same and

required to have placed underneath
such stone some non-combustible material
the full length and breadth thereof

No 3 The foregoing Ordinance to take effect
and being in force from and ^{after} five days
after its publication
