

*J* Ordinance No 97

Relating to City Police

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany

Section 1<sup>st</sup> That if any person or persons shall between the hours of ten o'clock P.M. and five o'clock a.m. make any noise or disturbance so as to disturb the peace and quiet of the public or to disturb the peace and quiet of the occupants of dwellings and places of residences adjacent to where said noise or disturbance is made. Such person or persons shall upon conviction thereof be fined in the sum of not less than five dollars or more than twenty dollars but before any person or persons shall be convicted of making any noise or disturbance as aforesaid it shall be the duty of the person or persons so disturbed to notify such person or persons to discontinue said noise or disturbance

Section 2<sup>nd</sup> If any person or persons shall permit any noise or disturbance as mentioned and set forth in section one of this ordinance. to be made on the premises occupied by him or them said person or persons shall be fined in the sum of not less than five dollars or more than twenty five dollars

But before conviction can be had him or they shall be entitled to the notice mentioned in section one of this ordinance

Section 3<sup>rd</sup> This ordinance to be in force from and after five days after its publication
