

Ordinance No. 125

An Ordinance to amend section 2, of Ordinance 12, entitled and ordinances relating to the material to be used, and the manner of building sidewalks and crosswalks.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany:

Sec 1. The crossways to be of red or yellow fir (3) three inches thick, by not less than (8) eight, nor more than (12) twelve inches wide, evenly planed, and to be nailed on bearings to be made of red fir, (3) three by (6) six inches, of oak (4) four; said bearing to be double, and placed two (2) inches apart where the ends of deck planks come together; (7) seven of such being to be under each section; said crossways to be from (3) three to (6) six feet wide, as the Committee on streets and Public Property may direct. The edges of said crossways to be beveled, and a layer of gravel (3) three inches deep, and (3) three feet wide, to be spread on each side of said crossways, and to extend the whole length of the same, the gravel to be raised to the level of the plank.

Sec 2. All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances in conflict, with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec 3. This Ordinance to be in force, from and after its publication.
