

Ordinance No 280,

An Ordinance Authorizing, and directing the Committee on Streets, and Public Property of the City of Albany, Oregon, to have the "High Steel Bridge", across the Willamette river, at Calapooia street redocked, to purchase the materials required, and hire the work done.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

O.S. 280

Section 1. The Committee on Streets, and Public Property of the City of Albany, Oregon, are hereby authorized, and directed to purchase, at the lowest market price, and on the best terms possible, not to exceed 125,000 feet, (or so much thereof as may be required to redock the "High Steel Bridge", across the Willamette river,) of the best quality of red fir lumber, to be of even thickness, and three (3) inches thick, twelve (12) inches wide, and sixteen (16) feet in length; the plank required to make the treads on the approaches, to be ripped diagonally. And said Committee are hereby further authorized, and directed to purchase such other material, that may be required for such work, at the lowest market price, and to employ a sufficient number of hands to do the work.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force from, and after its approval by the Mayor.
