ORDINANCE NO. 1070

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE concerning the display of fruits, vegetables and other merchandise upon the sidewalks in the City of Albany and providing a penalty for the violation thereof:

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. That it is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to display fruits, vegetables or other merchandise on any street in the City of Albany, or in the recesses of any store or place of business for display, to place said fruit, vegetables or merchandise less than eighteen inches (18") high from the floor or top of any street, sidewalk or floor.

Section II. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court, for each and every such offense, be find not less than One Dollar (\$1) nor more than Ten Dollars (\$10), or by imprisonment in the City jail not less than one day nor more than five days in default of the payment of such fine.
