

ORDINANCE NO. 1896

A BILL FOR:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1496, which is an Ordinance defining and punishing offenses against the public peace, safety, morals and general welfare, by adding a section making LARCENY of goods or chattels of a value not less than Thirty Five Dollars (\$35.00) unlawful, and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Ordinance No. 1496 shall be amended by adding thereto a section known as Section No. 3-A, under the sub-head Larceny.

2. LARCENY. It shall be unlawful for any person to steal any goods or chattels which are the property of another and if the property stolen shall not exceed the value of Thirty Five Dollars (\$35.00) such person upon conviction shall be punished as provided for in Section 84 of said Ordinance No. 1496 which is amended by this section.

3. Inasmuch as the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Albany requires that this ordinance shall become immediately effective, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall become immediately effective upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
