ORDINANCE NO. 2172

AN ORDINARDS PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND MANNER OF HOLDING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF ALLANY, OLDION AND IN THE TEMPLICATY SOUGHT TO BE ALMENED, ON THE 19TH DAY OF MAY, 1950, FOR THE PURPOLE OF SUB-MITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF SAID CITY AND SAID TEXTINGY SOUGHT TO BE ALREAD, FOR THEIR ADOPTION OR HEJECTION, A PROPOSED ALEMENT TO THE CHARTER OF SAID CITY AS SUBLITTED TO THE VOTERS BY RESOLUTION NO. 114 ACCPTED BY THE MAYON AND COUNCIL MANCH 22, 1950.

THE PROPER OF THE CITY OF ALBALY DO GRDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That in the manner provided by law and this ordinance and for the purposeset forth herein, a special election shall be held in the City of Albany, Oregon on the 19th day of May, 1950, this being the time for the regular Primary Election, commencing at the hour of 8:00 A.A. and continuing until 8:00 P.F. of said day, such hours to be established by the time that is then recognized in the City of Albany, whether the same be Pacific Standard Time or the proposed Daylight Savings Time .

Section 2. The following are hereby designated as the voting places of said elections

Ward No. 1 Precinct #10 - Girl Scout Cabin Precinent #1 - Maple School Building

Precinct # 2 - Maple School Building

Precinct # 3 - First Floor Courthouse Precinct #11 - Mission Covenant Church, 1098 W. 16th Avenue Precinct #12 - Damon (formerly Dillon)Kotel, Cabins 13 and 14.
13th Avenue and Washington Street

The Judges and Clerks shall qualify by subscribing to an oath in the manner and form provided by law, and in case any of such officers shall fail to attend then those present shall elect another to act in his place.

Section 5. The City Recorder shall cause notice of said election to be given by publication thereof in the Albany Democrat-Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published in said City of Albany, Oregon, once a week for four successive weeks, the first publication to be not less than thirty (30) days previous to the date of the election.

Section 6. At the said election proposed Amendment to the Charter of the City of Albany shall be submitted to the legal voters for their adoption or rejection as provided in Resolution No. 114 adopted by the Council on the 22nd day of March, 1950, said resolution now being on file and of record in the office of the Recorder of said City.

Section 7. The ballot title of the proposed Charter Amendment submitted to the voters as provided in Resolution No. 114 shall be as follows:

PROPOSITION FOR THE ANNEXATION OF A CERTAIN TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF ALBANT, OREGON, SUBNITTED BY THE COUNCIL OF SAID CITY.

Beginning at the southwest corner of the presently constituted city limits which is the southwest corner of the Bureau of Mines' property and running thence northerly and parallel to the presently constituted city limits to a point on the western boundary line of the city limits of the City of Albany, Linn County, Oregon, where the southern boundary of the Masonic Cemetery if extended easterly intersects the western boundary of the bity limits of the City of Albany, Oregon, and running thence westerly a distance of 550' along and parallel to the southern boundary of the Masonic Cemetery; running thence southerly to a point on the north line of Block 1 of Sprenger's Supplemental Plat to Hazelwood which is the point where the east line of Gale Street if extended northerly would intersect the north line of Sprenger's Supplemental Plat to Hazelwood; running thence westerly along and in line with the north boundary of Block 1 of Sprenger's Supplemental Plat to Pizelwood to a point where the eastern boundary of Hop Street if extended northerly would intersect the north line of Sprenger's Supplemental Plat if extended westerly; running thence southerly to a point which is the southwest corner of Block 14 of Hazelwood Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon; running thence westerly and in line with the southern line of Block 14 a distance of 30' to a point on the eastern boundary of Block 44; thence southerly along the eastern lines of Block 44 and . Block 43 to a point which is the most easterly southeast corner of Block 43 of Hazelwood Addition; running thence westerly along the southern line of Block 43 a distance of 250'; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Block 43 a distance of 2421 to the most southerly southeast corner of Block 43; running thence westerly along the southern boundary of Blocks 43, 42 and 41 to a point where the eastern boundary of Block 32 if extended northerly would intersect the southern line of Block 41; running thence southerly along and in line with the eastern line of Block 32 to a point which is the most easterly southeast corner of Block 32; running thence westerly a distance of 210' along a southerly boundary of Block 32 which is the northern line of Sixteenth Avenue; thence southerly along and in line with the western line of Block 31 of Hazelwood Addition a distance of 1,100; running thence southeasterly to a point which is 600! N. 890 42' W. of the southwest corner of the presently constituted city limits which is the southwest corner of the Bureau of Mines! property, running thence easterly to the point of beginning.

Shall the above described territory be annexed to the City of Albany, Oregon:

Section 8. That special election in the territory sought to be annexed herein shall be held in said territory at the same time and in the same manner for holding the special election in the City of Albany as hereinabove designed and that such election shall be in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Charter of the City of Albany and the statutes of the State of Oregon pertaining thereto.

Section 9. That the place within the territory hereinabove designated for the holding of such special election and the names and the judges and the clerks are as follows, to-wit:

The place of election shall be at the residence of Mrs. V.W. Mason, 820 Broadway.
