

Ordinance No. 313.

An Ordinance declaring the probable cost of improving that part of Lyon Street in the City of Albany, from the south line of First Street to the depot of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, and ascertaining and determining the proportionate share of such cost to be borne by, and assessed against each lot, or part thereof abutting on said portion of Lyon Street proposed to be improved, and directing the City Recorder to enter a statement thereof in the docket of City liens.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1: That there be and is hereby assessed on each of the following described lots, and parts of lots lying, and abutting on Lyon Street, between the south line of First Street to the depot of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, the amounts hereinafter provided set out, and indicated, the same being the proportionate share of the probable cost of said improvement, assessed against, and to be borne by said lots, and parts of lots respectively, to wit:

Section 2: The Recorder of the City of Albany is hereby directed to enter a statement of the above assessments in the docket of City liens, in accordance with the provisions of section 69, Chapter 7, of the Charter of the City of Albany.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force, from, and after its approval by the Mayor.
