

ORDINANCE NO. 403

An Ordinance to regulate and restrain establishments where gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for hire, and to provide for the closing of such establishments between certain hours and upon the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

The Board of the City of Albany do ordain as follows: -
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons engaged in keeping or carrying on any establishment where public gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for public use or for hire to keep such establishment open between the hours of twelve o'clock, midnight and six o'clock in the morning, or upon the first day of the week commonly called Sunday.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder, be punished by fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$25 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than 5 days or more than 10 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This act shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
